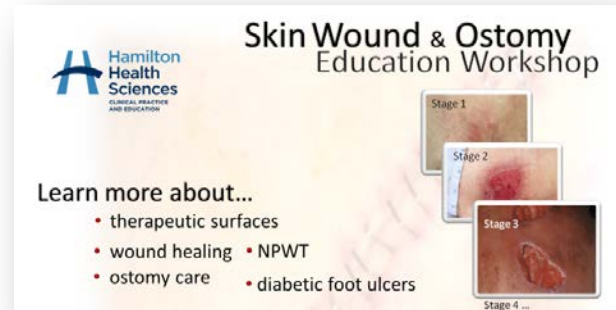


Skin Wound & Ostomy (SWO) Workshop Overview

The Skin Wound Ostomy Workshop is an interactive, multimodal, educational event for both new learners and existing staff who wish to enhance or refresh their wound knowledge and skills. Learners will have the opportunity to review content and practice techniques relevant to basic and advanced wound care practices.

This workshop builds upon the e-Learning module and allows the learner to:



- understand wound assessment and wound bed preparation
- develop an understanding of the role of dressing selection in wounds
- understand how to care for a patient with an ostomy
- learn the application of Negative Pressure Wound Therapy
- practice using the Braden scale and identifying appropriate therapeutic surfaces
- develop an understanding of pressure areas and staging of ulcers using the RAO BPG
- review fecal incontinence management and incontinence associated dermatitis
- identify the care and needs of the bariatric patient
- discuss the role of nutrition and the OT in wound care and pressure management
- understand venous/arterial/diabetic foot ulcers and associated treatments
- review diabetes and wounds
- review appropriate order sets and proper documentation
- complete hands on sessions

Target Group

All healthcare professionals involved in assessing wounds and performing wound care.
